The 7th Annual Doctoral Colloquium, hosted by the School of Computing and Information Systems, is now accepting abstracts and poster submissions.

The Colloquium gives CIS graduate researchers the opportunity to present their research in a supportive environment and receive feedback from a wide audience of peers, academics and industry representatives

There will be an emphasis on presentations that focus on real-world impacts and applications. We ask you to consider a wider audience – beyond your immediate research peers.

CIS careers will be another major focus. The event will include employer discussion panels with representatives from academia, industry, government, and NGOs, as well as opportunities for networking.

Presentation Track

We are accepting all current, past and early research work for the presentation track.

Please submit a 400-word abstract (or less) that focuses on the real-world impacts and applications of your work. We want you to consider a wider audience – beyond your immediate research peers. Hence, in your abstract submission, we ask you to address an educated audience that has little knowledge on your subject matter.

Poster Track

We are accepting all current and ongoing research work for the poster track, including research posters that were prepared for other academic events.

To apply for the poster track, **please submit a 100-word abstract**.

The colloquium will be an excellent opportunity to discuss potential directions of your research.

Because of the broad spectrum of topics, we strongly advise poster authors to supplement their submissions with background materials.

Eligibility

All CIS graduate researchers are eligible and encouraged to submit. We welcome research at all levels of progress and completion.

Prizes

There will be both top and honorary prizes awarded to selected presentations and posters. We have some great prizes this year, including **iPad Pros!**

Note: If you won a prize in last year's colloquium, you will only be eligible to win again this year if you present a new piece of research.
